REPORTS

4-1 PRESIDENT

Maritime Bus

Board Finance & Audit

We had a meeting and acknowledged the reality of another potential cut to the operating grant from the province. The board F & A committee meetings are always pretty heavy, but I'd like to say that the University – so far – has been very open and approachable with all of our questions concerning budget.

Phillip Brown

Danielle and I met with Phillip Brown who is the Director of Regional Affairs for MP Gail Shea. We had a very productive meeting that served two functions: first, it allowed Danielle and I to test-run our "lobby skills" and second, we were able to gauge the possible reaction from the Minister through her Director of R..A.

Minister of Innovation & Advanced Learning: Allen Roach

All five executive members were finally able to meet with Minister Roach and we used this opportunity to ask some straightforward questions about the operating grant and the discussions surrounding it. It was by no means enlightening or encouraging, but we did reinforce the fact that there needs to be stronger and more frequent communications between the SU and himself.

Digafie, who works in the International Office here at UPEI is looking to make over the pit (in the library) in order to be more of a social space for all students as opposed to a study area. I've asked Jon to work on this as well to see what kind of progress we can make together.

Meetings with President Alaa + VP A&F Jackie, Comptroller Tara, & Librarian Mark

In the last week, we've had two meetings with the UPEI President Alaa, Jackie Podger (VP A&F) and Tara Judson (Comptroller) to discuss how the money juggling will pan out for students. Out of this conversation came the topic of textbooks, access codes and other supplementary materials. What can we do to alleviate the financial burden on students while publishing companies are continuing to drive prices up? We discussed our idea of creating a policy that would say that any supplementary materials assigned for marks cannot exceed XX% of the course fee. President Alaa was excited about these kinds of ideas and decided we needed to form a working group with University Librarian Mark Leggott in order to explore the future of textbooks at UPEI. 4-6 SENATE

The first item on the agenda was the discussion of scholarships and a presentation by Laura Lee

Noonan. The short version of this presentation was that there are less scholarships, but more money for

students. Therefore, each individual scholarship is larger on the whole. However, the report was

preliminary so there needs to be more research and a more complete picture will be delivered in the

future.

The next item discussed was the president's report. In this report, Dr. Aziz discussed a number

of things, including:

- The Macleans magazine university ranking, in which UPEI fell from 4th place to 5th place. Dr.

Aziz's explanations for this were, firstly, that the difference between 1st and 10th is so small to begin

with, that the difference between 4th and 5th is infinitesimally small. As well, the way in which we

report scholarship money/number of awards could affect our rating, and the measure of the school's "reputation" is arbitrary.

- The dare to dream campaign is going well. There have been over 130 submissions which will be

considered over the next few months. Dr. Aziz does not expect that all will be implemented, but that is

the ultimate goal of the project.

- Dr. Aziz was leaving the country shortly after the senate meeting, and will be meeting with alumni and re-networking with them. As well, Dr. Aziz will be travelling to Dublin on Monday and will be

visiting the University College Dublin to discuss collaboration with a 2+2 business program with our

institutions.

Following the president's report, Don Desserud gave his presentation on the reorganization and

restructuring of senate committees.

Finally, the final enrolment numbers were presented. The number of full-time UPEI students roughly remained the same, which increases amongst the graduate student and international student

population, and small decreases in Canadian undergraduate students. However, Dr. Aziz did point out

that over the next six years Prince Edward Island will have a significant shift in demographics such that

there will be less students in the PEI school system, potentially resulting in fewer UPEI students. These

are future problems which much be addressed.

Discussion:

- -Danielle suggested the possibility of having someone on the committee that knows the documents very well; Travis, Jon and Bob said council chooses who will be on committee and it is their responsibility to make sure the proper people are on it.

-Kate noted that the Chair is usually a 2 year position and the President and the Chair should be well versed in the documents. Kate also said that having a returning councillor on the committee might lead to a returning councillor might not want to be on committee.

*Note: Danielle MacDonald voted favor. Jon Millington, Amy Doyle, and Travis Gordon abstained.

Amendment: MacDonald/MacLean; To change section J under "II Committee Structures" in the Standing Committee By-Law that 3 out of 5 members should be returning councillors.

- -Danielle made the point that sometimes Chair and President are new and aren't very familiar with how committee works.
- -Noted on why Policy Committee needs to be taken out of President's Committee because it wasn't the highest priority on President's Committee's list.

- -Travis thinks that 2 out of 5 are reasonable because a lot of the time chair and president are returning.
- -Heather said members shouldn't be tied because new members might want to learn and have the experience to deal with the working of the Student Union Policy.
