- **4-1 PRESIDENT**

All of this paid off when we finally arrived in the nation's capital and began to meet with decision makers. All in all, I had seven meetings with MP's and senators, over four days of lobbying. This included meetings with three MP's from PEI, one of with was Minister Gail Shea. This was one of six meetings CASA had over the week with ministers. We also were able to meet with three out of four party leaders and the Prime Minister's Office. After my second lobby conference with CASA I can confidently say that our money is well spent being a part of this organization. Many times over the week we were told by people we were meeting with that CASA's policy work is top notch and that our solutions to improve education in Canada are extremely pragmatic.

Before we left for Ottawa, I had meetings of the planning committee, the honorary degree committee and the General Manager search committee. We have now short listed to five candidates and will be performing interviews on Monday and Tuesday. If everything goes according to plan, we will have a recommendation to bring forward at our next meeting of council.

4-2 EXECUTIVE VP

Hi Everyone,

Like Rob I've been away from the office for the past week with CASA for Lobby Con. This was my first time at the conference and I'm really happy with how the week went. I met with three Prince Edward Island MPs, an NDP from British Columbia named Fin Donnelly, and New Brunswick liberal Dominic Leblanc. If anybody's interested in learning a bit more about how exactly the week and meetings work I would be more than happy to discuss it at some other time. Aside from the actual lobbying portion of the week we also had our regular opening and closing plenaries, which are essentially the equivalent of our council meetings. One discussion worth noting was a particularly heated debate surrounding the CASA transition system. As it stands currently there are three main CASA conferences as well as three separate transitions, one for each region. There was a motion from the board to change the structure to 4 national conferences and scrap the three regional transitions. They would shorten the length of each conference by a day or two, have a national transition in a central location like Ottawa, Toronto, or Montreal, and hopefully then have more time to elect members to the CASA board.

Most seemed to agree that this might result in a better transition process but there was an overwhelming response from smaller schools, mostly from the east, that had problems with the higher costs associated with the change. Schools like CBU, STFX, St. Thomas, Acadia, and other particularly small schools, including ourselves, didn't feel that it would be appropriate to pay the extra travel that would incur when the system itself isn't really flawed enough to warrant the change. In the end we voted against it and the motion wasn't passed.

On the subject of CASA fees I would like to add that beyond the benefits that students receive from CASA's actions, the benefit that we get from interacting with student leaders from across the country dealing with the same issues as us is priceless.

Unfortunately I had to miss last week's ARPC meeting as well as the first of my financial sustainability committee meetings. This week I have an academic appeals meeting and a meeting with Jim Randall, but aside from that I don't have anything else to report on tonight.
