Mayor Philip Brown - January 7th

The four of us had the opportunity to sit down with Mayor Brown to talk about some of the key issues facing students. The key areas of discussion was around affordable housing, transit schedules, and clean sidewalks around the University. I would say he was very interested in transit and how we can better support students who live in the East Royalty area. Moving forward we will have a follow up meeting with him, other councillors, and staff members. PEILCC Cannabis campaign - January 8th

Myself and Sarah where reached out to by the PEILCC about organizing an awareness campaign around safe and responsible use of cannabis. We are currently in the stages of organizing this event and would love to hear feedback or suggestions of how to make this event as informative as possible. The government is also really interested in us running this event and will be paying the bill to host this campaign.

Student Centre Management Committee - January 10th

SCMC is responsible for overseeing our building with reps from UPEI and the UPEISU making decisions about how our building operates. Usually we don't have a whole lot to say that will pertain to council however at our last meeting we did discuss turning our building into a 24 hour space for students to study, hangout, or a place to warm up during the winter months. We are in the early stages but the university is open to the idea and seemed supported. We need to do some research first and look into the safety our students and building.

Senate - January 11th

At the last senate meeting the main points of interest included the creation of a third convocation, last year the university had some issues with seating and because of fire regulations they had to turn some family members away from the ceremony. As the university grows so will this ceremony, currently it is being reviewed by the convocation committee which I do sit on and we will be making a decision in the coming weeks, at this point we are unsure if it will affect this years graduation however this has yet to be decided. Honorary Degrees are also being considered and we will be choosing candidates in the coming month.
