## **Introduction**

This budget hopefully will reflect the expected cost of UPEISU operations for the 2019-2020 year.

## **History Book**

The History Researcher and I have been meeting weekly. I'm happy to report that we are on track to finish the content on the book by May 1, afterwards it will be sent to printing. After realising that we have way more people to interview than we thought, I have stepped up to collect information for people around campus. I expect both of us will be interviewing one or two people a week.

We have not signed with a publisher yet, I have a meeting March 11th with the Alumni Department to finalize how exactly we want the book to look like. Alumni will be taking most of the books off our hands once they arrive, however we need to decide exactly how many we want to keep and how UPEISU/Alumni will sell them, those after March 11 we should know exactly how many books we'll be getting and what they will look like.
